PASTOR PETER IS NOW RETIRED

Earlier this year, Pastor Peter announced he would retire when his appointment ended on June 30. As luck would have it, his health became an issue demanding his full attention and in fairness to the church, he thought it was best to move his last day to February 21.

He informed Megan Stowe, our District Superintendent, of his wishes and she immediately began working on a two-part plan. Her first step was to meet with the Staff Parish Relations Committee to talk about us, who we are, what we want and what we like. Megan is very firm that she will not give us merely a warm body. The first part of her plan is to cover now to June 30, and the second part is from July 1 and forward. It is possible the first plan will become the second, depending on how good a match we have. Megan is very concerned that we do have a good match and I am optimistic that we will have a new life, as happens when churches change pastors.

The elephant in the room is the issue of whether we will stay open and whether we will be forced to merge with another church. Megan is not interested in closing churches; she wants us to succeed and I believe we need to see this time as an opportunity for growth and change. I realize change is a 4-letter word, but keep in mind, if a living thing is not changing, it is not living.

I am urging everyone to stay connected and to stay positive. View this as an opportunity to find a new part of who we are and what we do. We have many gifts among us, and this is a chance to tap into those gifts. It is typical to become comfortable with a pastor and to be at a point where we can't envision life beyond that person, but all churches experience a change of pastors and we need to embrace the change.

Please keep in mind that since noon, February 21, Peter is not our pastor, so please do not call him. Our pastor of record until someone is appointed, is Rev. Please, if you have not yet joined worship via Zoom, give it a try. We have few ways of connecting with each other right now, and that is the main vehicle for the time being. We visit after worship and Donna and Carol tell us how warm it is in Florida while we shiver here. Pretty soon we will be able to either use the sanctuary or at least be outdoors in the parking lot or the pavilion.
