## <u>From Pastor</u>



My dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

When Christianity became the religion of the Roman Empire, the days between December 25<sup>th</sup> and January 6<sup>th</sup> became known as the Twelve Holy Days, and for us these days also bear the name, Christmastide, or the Twelve Days of Christmas which is often heard sung either with glee, or dread, depending on the listener.

January 6<sup>th</sup> too, has a variety of name; Epiphany, Twelfth Day, and Three Kings Day, and the Christian Festival of Epiphany is even older than the celebration of Christmas! Epiphany means manifestation or appearance. This was originally a celebration of Jesus' baptism, by John in the Jordan river, when God voice was heard saying, "This is my beloved Son." Thus, during the baptism, God became manifest in Jesus Christ. Since the fifth century, however, the celebration of Epiphany in the western Christian churches only stresses the visit of the Wise Men to the Christ Child, for to them it was manifested that the Savior of all mankind had been born.

The bible tells us very little about the "Three Kings." It doesn't tell us that they were Kings or Magi, it gives them no names, nor does it tell us how many there were that made this visitation to worship the Holy Child, we are told only that "There came wise men from the east". Yet we are blessed with church traditions, as well as legends and wonderful stories that tell us of the "Three Kings of the orient who came bearing gifts, following the light of a star" in the beautiful hymn written and composed by, John H. Hopkins in 1857. Let us join them as we reverently bend our knee in acknowledging the Christ as our Lord and Savior also.

I want to express my sincere thanks for the warm welcome you have given me in this short time that I have been able to serve you as your interim pastor, and I look forward to being able to come back occasionally to be with you as pulpit supply or bible study until such time as you will again have your own pastor appointed to serve you. Please know

that this is not good-bye, because friends do not say good-bye to friends, and

I will see you all again soon.
