We are also at a place where we need to examine how we connect with the community, or if we do. We are failing in our mission if we hunker down in our building and don't actively work to spread the Word. That doesn't mean standing on a soapbox and professing your faith. It means being the hands and feet of God, loving one another as we love God, feeding God's sheep. It has been said that the only bible some people may ever see is you. The goal is not to fill the church, the goal is to bring people to God, then God will fill the church.

The catch is that if you are not part of the planning, you are allowing others to represent you, and I for one, want to be part of that. I want to know that people are representing me (us, the church) in a way that is acceptable. Nobody should have to take on an entire project, and as the saying goes, many hands make light work.

Remember the fun we have had doing some things from the past? Apple dumplings were a LOT of work, but we had a good time. The tag sales were also lots of work, but think of the fellowship and the surprise of seeing old friends. You have to actually be there to have those experiences.

I am going to work to see if we can have a plant sale, so if you start seeds, divide plants or dig some up from your garden, please let me know. We have other sources to explore too. Such an activity brings people to us and we have a great opportunity to show them how nice we are. We don't need to evangelize, just be our friendly selves. If concern about not knowing anyone is keeping somebody from coming to worship, that might change their concerns. I learned from Karen that the name of the game is relationships, and the longer I live, the more I see that she is right. So, if you have an idea about an event that would help form relationships, speak up! I would love to hear your thoughts, so please email or text me, or grab me, or anyone, to talk about it. It would be helpful if you put a couple of notes on paper, so later when we try to recall what you said, it will be at our fingertips.
