FROM OUR LAY LEADER

Somewhere along the line, you may have heard I have something to do with Neighbors Helping Neighbors, the food pantry that serves South Hadley and Granby. I want to say first, that if it weren't for this church, there likely would not be a pantry here. It was not a popular concept among many people. Fortunately, churches are in touch with real people and their problems, and that is the group mainly responsible for creating the pantry.

Through the years, and despite many naysavers, the pantry has grown to be a significant force in our community. You may ask, how did this happen? It happened because there were people who believed it was needed and understood that a community where there are people without adequate food, is weak and ineffective. That was the motivation to keep it going and growing, and it has gotten bigger and better. You might make a vague parallel to Christianity: it grew because people helped people. In the early days of the church, people cared for one another. They could count on the church to help them, and as they learned about Jesus, who wanted the best for all people, they wanted to be part of that goodness.

Society seems to have abandoned the concept of God and church. Possibly, this has happened because people don't see the church as relevant anymore. I think the church and the people have drifted in opposite directions partly because they don't speak the same language. Churches don't understand people who don't prefer organized worship, but are being the hands and feet of God. And those who eschew church services don't grasp the power of worshiping together. And I believe that is part of our church's declining attendance.

Although I have deep concern about our future, at the same time I am convinced we can work together to turn things around. The first step is to get back in church. We all belong for a reason, and I doubt that reason has left. I know how easy it is to let inertia keep us home, but you should know there are people there who would love to see you. I can (but won't) name people I really miss seeing there. It is easy to have a reason to stay home, but look deep inside and see if that is a reason or an excuse. With more people, we can do more things that will enrich our souls and others' lives, and in the process, keep our church alive. The time is coming when we will have to leave our building if we don't get up and do something.
